A few updates on subjects that were brought forth at the annual meeting:

The dam at Hay Creek was built in 1938, probably by the CCC boys. The dam is owned by the State of Minnesota, who's inspection occurs every 10 years. The last one was in 2016. Deterioration of concrete was noted, but the dam is considered safe.

The road resurfacing on Highway 71 is progressing rapidly. By the time you receive the newsletter the majority, if not all of the work, may be completed. However, please use caution and lookout for the crews still doing finishing work.

The Line 3 pipeline project was approved and appears ready to start.
